Our legal bases for processing of your data

If the legal basis is not listed in the Privacy Policy, the following applies:

- We always obtain the data subject's consent for processing, Art. 6 (1) Clause 1 lit. a) GDPR is the legal basis.
- In case of processing of personal data necessary for the fulfillment of a contract or agreement. Art. 6 (1) Clause 1 lit. b) GDPR is the legal basis.
- In processing of personal data is necessary for the fulfillment of a legal obligation. Art. 6 (1) Clause 1 lit. c) GDPR is the legal basis.
- In any event that vital interests of the data subject or of another natural person require a processing of personal data. Art. 6 (1) Clause 1 lit. d) GDPR is the legal basis.
- When and if processing is necessary to safeguard legitimate interests of our company or of a third party and if the interests, basic rights, and basic freedoms of the data subject do not outweigh these legitimate interests. Art. 6 (1) Clause 1 lit. f) GDPR is the legal basis.
